

### European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD)

#### **Examples of expected achievements**

- The RDP for the Czech Republic focuses mainly on ensuring the sustainable management of natural resources and encouraging
  climate friendly farming practices, with around 25 % of agricultural land under contract to protect biodiversity, 11 % to improve
  water management and 12 % to protect soil. Nearly 870 000 ha of farmland will be subject to voluntary agri-environmental and
  climate-related commitments by farmers, who will receive training and advice.
- The second focus is to increase the competitiveness of agriculture and forestry as well as that of the food industry aiming to provide
  investment support to 3 500 farms, almost 1 450 investment projects in forestry technologies and 830 projects in the food industry.
  It will also support around 420 land consolidation projects, it will build and/or modernize 830 km of forest roads and will invest in
  modern technologies on around 900 private forestry enterprises.
- Almost 250 cooperation projects are to be supported including 20 projects within EIP Operational Groups,.
- The RDP will support renewable energy investments to process agricultural waste and it will also support the afforestation of 1 000 ha of agricultural land in order to increase CO2 sequestration.
- The RDP will also help boosting the rural economy by creating almost 1 900 new jobs. Generational renewal will be enhanced by providing start-up support to 750 young farmers. Only priority 6 will create 750 jobs and will support 160 Local Action Groups (LAGs) in the context of multi-funded CLLD initiatives.
- Knowledge transfer and advisory services will provide training to almost 19 000 participants and specific advisory services to 3 000.

## **Examples of key challenges**

- In the Czech Republic 50 % of the agricultural land is classified as affected by natural constraints limiting its production potential.
- The countryside is mainly uplands and highlands. 61 % of its territory is 400 m or more above sea level.
- Only 14 % of species and habitats are in a favourable state. 40 % of agricultural land is at risk of soil erosion.
- Over 80 % of rural people commute to work. This reduces the demand for products and services produced in rural areas and the feasibility of entrepreneurship in rural areas.
- Around 90 % of farms are small and cover only 30 % of the agricultural area.
- The average labour productivity in agriculture has been increasing, but this is still lower than the average for the EU.




