Examples of expected achievements

- The overarching objective of the RDP is achieving "Green conversion and green jobs" with a target of almost 1 000 new green jobs.
- Farm investments of the pig and cattle sectors aim to restructure 3 300 farms (8 % of the total), while simultaneously targeting environment, climate and animal welfare.
- Almost 100 cooperation projects will be established while the European Innovation Partnership (EIP) can also be supported.
- Half of the allocated amount under the priority of restoring, preserving and enhancing ecosystems will be used for area based payments to cover the cost of farmers adopting environment/climate friendly land management practices. Organic farming is an important element. It is envisaged to double the area so it covers 12 % of the agricultural area.
- Almost 3 000 environment/climate friendly and resource efficient farm investments are envisaged.
- Over 700 investments will aim at reducing Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions, while almost 200 jobs are created through green conversion.
- A total of 26 Local Action Groups (LAGs) will implemented the CLLD/LEADER bottom-up approach covering 51 % of the rural population creating jobs and improving living conditions.

Examples of key challenges

- A challenge, which arises from the relatively low employment rate in the agricultural sector, is the lack of innovators and entrepreneurs in rural areas. It is difficult to attract and maintain a well-educated work force in these areas due, among other things, to a lack of basic services.
- Annual gross investment in the Danish agricultural sector has decreased by 50 % in the last five years, while the debt levels of agricultural holdings have more than doubled. During this time the productivity and profitability has stagnated.
- Over the last 10 years the number of farms has decreased by 35 %, while the average farm size has almost doubled to 63 ha.
- The Danish agriculture sector accounts for 16 % of GHG emissions of the country, which is above the EU average.
- Over 90 % of the utilised agricultural area is arable land characterised by intensive and specialised production putting pressure on certain ecosystems and high nature value areas.

Priority 1 is considered a cross-cutting priority: the budget under Priorities 2 - 6 contributes to the achievement of Priority 1 targets.

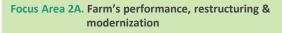

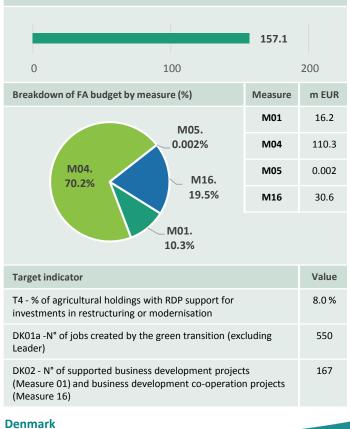

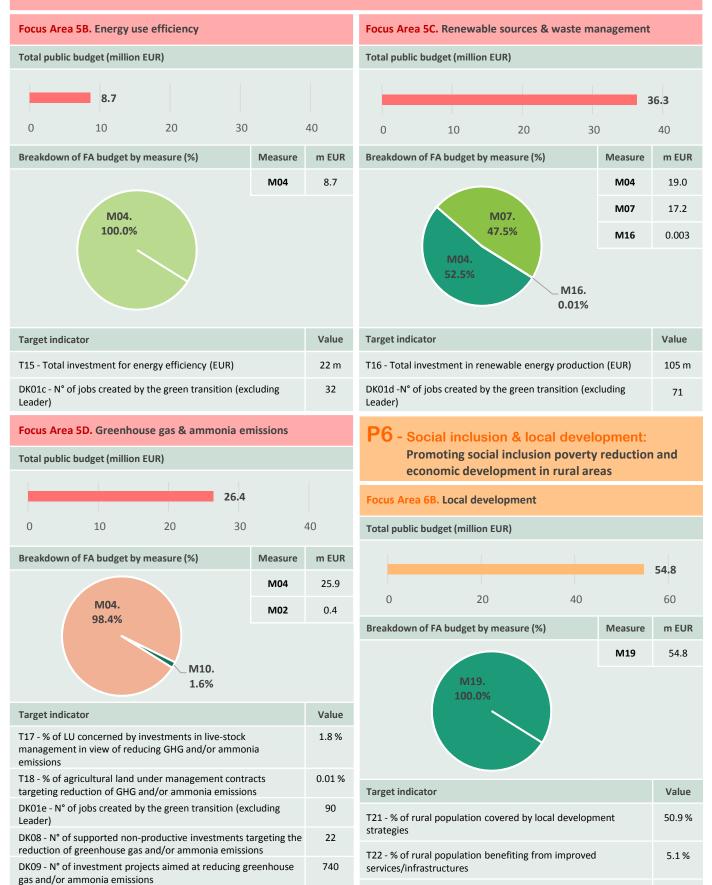

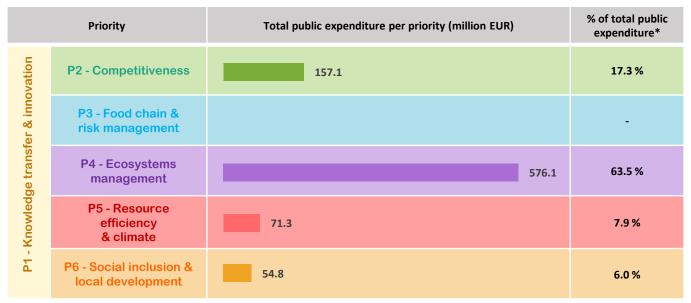

3. Planned expenditure per priority

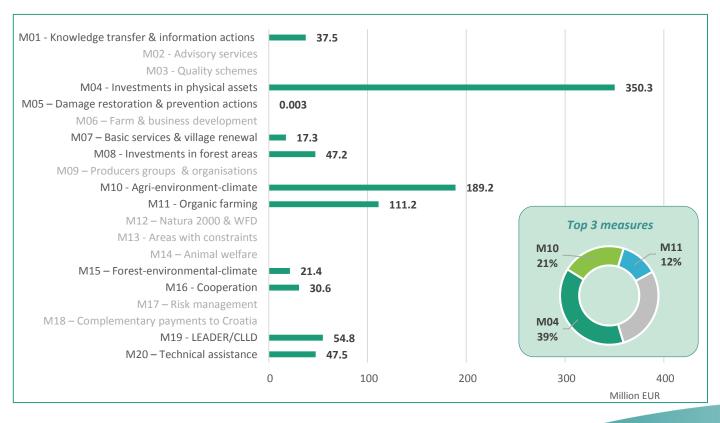

Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
