

Rural Development Programmes 2014-2020: Key facts & figures FOCUS AREA 3B: Farm risk prevention and management

1. Introduction

Focus Area (FA) 3B is designed to help farms to prevent and manage risk.

This can be supported through financial contributions of various kinds

- for insurance premiums and/or for mutual funds to cover losses caused by climate changes, diseases, pests or environmental incidents.
- to mutual funds to provide compensation to farmers facing a severe drop in their income.

These measures can be complemented by investments to restore agricultural production damaged by natural disasters as well as the measures for farm advice, knowledge transfer and training.

The target is to mobilise 5 billion EUR of public and private investments to support 644 000 farms.






- Agricultural area benefiting from investments for flood risk prevention: 163 386 ha

- **ES-Murcia** Percentage of total agricultural area which is supported after being damaged by natural disasters and catastrophes: **3.8** %


