

Examples of expected achievements

- With RDP support around 42 000 people will be trained to increase the knowledge and skills of those employed in the agricultural
 and forestry sectors.
- There will be 109 cooperation projects while 33 Operational Groups will be established under the European Innovation Partnership.
- · Nearly 2 000 holdings are expected to receive investment support so that they can become more modern and competitive.
- Start-up aid will be provided to 5 000 small farmers and 1 000 young farmers.
- Almost 1 500 farms will receive support for participating in quality schemes, local markets, short supply chains and producer organisations.
- RDP support will enable an increase in the organic area by 40 %.
- Investments which improve the resilience and environmental value of forest ecosystems will be supported through more than 4 500 projects covering 6 300 ha.
- Renewable energy production will be supported via almost 800 operations for investments.
- · More than 2 000 non-agricultural jobs will be created through the diversification and development of small enterprises.
- 45 LEADER Local Action Groups (LAGs) will be selected to implement Local Development Strategies (LDS), covering 40 % of the rural
 population.

Examples of key challenges

- Average crop yields in Croatia are lower than in other EU countries due to outdated technologies and frequent droughts.
- As a result of climate change Croatia is increasingly exposed to extreme weather conditions causing droughts and floods while only
 around 1 % of agricultural land is irrigated.
- The abandonment and the intensification of farming in High Nature Value areas have a negative impact on biodiversity.
- The production of renewable energy is also quite low.
- Only 2.4 % of the total agricultural land is currently used for organic farming.
- There is poor availability of basic services for the local rural population.


P1 - Knowledge transfer & innovation: Fostering knowledge transfer and innovation in agriculture, forestry, and rural areas






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

3. Planned expenditure per priority



The following chart shows which priorities and focus areas are selected in the RDP and the combination of measures used to address them. For each measure the budget breakdown per focus area is given. Priority 1 is considered to be cross-cutting and no separate financial allocation is shown as the expenditure is distributed across other focus areas. Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
