

Examples of expected achievements

- RDP support will make available around 111 600 training places for farmers to increase their knowledge and skills. 1 210 cooperations are envisaged, encouraging farm partnerships and establishing EIP Operational Groups.
- Almost 10 % of the Irish agricultural holdings will be restructured and modernised and another 3 % of holdings will benefit from support specifically targeted at young farmers. Although start-up support for young farmers is not included, prioritising investments by young farmers, providing them with a higher support rate, and facilitating their access to farmland, is central to the RDP strategy.
- Around 27 000 farmers are expected to participate in interactive Knowledge Transfer Groups, sharing best practice and improving their knowledge on a range of issues tailored to their individual farms.
- Particularly important are the well-targeted and prioritised Agri-environment-climate scheme, support to areas with natural
 constraints with a special focus on the Irish islands, and support to around 50 000 ha of organic farming. Ireland is aiming to place
 some 20 % of the agricultural land under contracts for each of the three areas of focus biodiversity, water management and soil
 erosion.
- Energy efficiency of the farming sector will be improved with an expected EUR 50 million investment, as well as by encouraging and supporting climate-friendly agricultural practices on over 10 % of the agricultural land.
- LEADER support is expected to create over 3 000 jobs in rural areas and three quarters of the rural population will be covered by Local Development Strategies (LDS).

Examples of key challenges

- The majority of agricultural grassland habitats in Ireland are not achieving favourable conservation status and this will be a key area to tackle with the RDP support.
- As Ireland's total Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions per capita are among the highest in the EU, and of the total GHG emissions
 agriculture accounts for the biggest share with 32 %, taking decisive action against climate change is an important challenge for the
 country.
- Less than 7 % of Irish farmers are under the age of 35 thus special effort is needed in terms of generational renewal.







3. Planned expenditure per priority



Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
