

RDPs 2014-2020: Key facts & figures Rural Development Priority 2: Enhance farm viability and competitiveness and the sustainable management of forests

1. Introduction

There are six EU Rural Development Priorities set for the 2014-2020 period. **Priority 2** aims at enhancing farm viability and competitiveness of all types of agriculture in all regions and promoting innovative farm technologies and the sustainable management of forests, with a focus on the following areas:

- a) improving the economic performance of all farms and facilitating farm restructuring and modernisation, notably with a view to increasing market participation and orientation as well as agricultural diversification (Focus Area 2A);
- b) facilitating the entry of adequately skilled farmers into the agricultural sector and, in particular, generational renewal (Focus Area 2B).



2. Expected achievements (EU-28)

This section provides information on the common target indicators defined for the Focus Areas under Priority 2 and examples of programmespecific target indicators defined by some RDPs to complement the common targets indicators. In addition, examples of common output indicators are introduced in this section.

4. Planned public expenditure on Priority 2






Figure 3 - Planned public expenditure per Member State and Focus Area (million EUR) and the percentage of the total planned public expenditure allocated to Priority 2

This section presents an overview of the planned public expenditure allocated to Priority 2. Figure 1 illustrates the distribution of the planned public expenditure on Priority 2 by Focus Area. Figure 2 shows the percentage of the total planned public expenditure allocated to Priority 2 per Member State. Figure 3 combines information on the planned public expenditure on Priority 2 per Member State and Focus Area (in million EUR) with the percentage of the total planned public expenditure allocated to Priority 2. For Member States with regional RDPs, the national planned public expenditure for the Priority is calculated as sum the of the regional RDPs.


