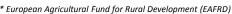

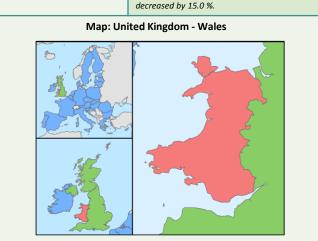

Examples of expected achievements

- Around 13 000 farmers will be trained to increase their knowledge and skills. In total 1 147 cooperation operations are envisaged, mainly encouraging farm partnerships or establishing Operational Groups under the European Innovation Partnership (EIP).
- More than 10 % of Welsh agricultural holdings will be restructured and modernised. Almost 1 % of holdings will benefit from support specifically targeted on young farmers.
- The RDP aims to protect 700 000 ha of farmland through environmental land management targeted on specific biodiversity, water management and soil erosion issues. The biodiversity and water management focus areas are the most important, since Wales is aiming to cover some 49 % of Welsh agricultural land under each of them.
- The programme will support investments and co-operation projects aimed at increasing efficiency in energy use in agriculture and food processing. Support will also target investments in renewable energy production and the reduction of Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions.
- Support under Priority 6 "Social inclusion and local development" is expected to create some 250 jobs in rural areas. Local Development Strategies (LDS) implemented by 18 Local Action Groups (LAGs) will have a focus on supporting jobs and growth.
- About half a million people will benefit from improved Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) and broadband infrastructure.

Examples of key challenges

- Natural resources, land, air and ecosystems provide the foundation for living and working in Wales. However around a third of the services provided by ecosystems in Wales have been assessed as currently declining.
- Total GHG emissions from agriculture and related land use for Wales have declined by around 21 % between 1990 and 2011. The ambition of Wales is to further reduce GHG emissions from agriculture.
- · As for the socio-economic context, the productivity of the rural workforce is relatively low.
- Concerning farming and forestry, Wales, has relatively low productivity when compared with its competitors. The lack of a skilled workforce is a barrier to growth for farms.
- Limited access to fast broadband remains a challenge for businesses and households.

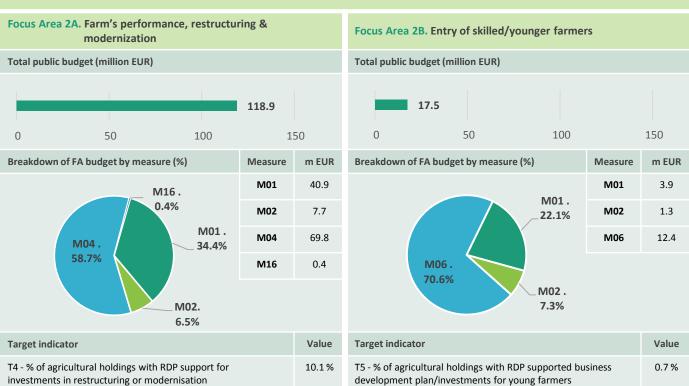

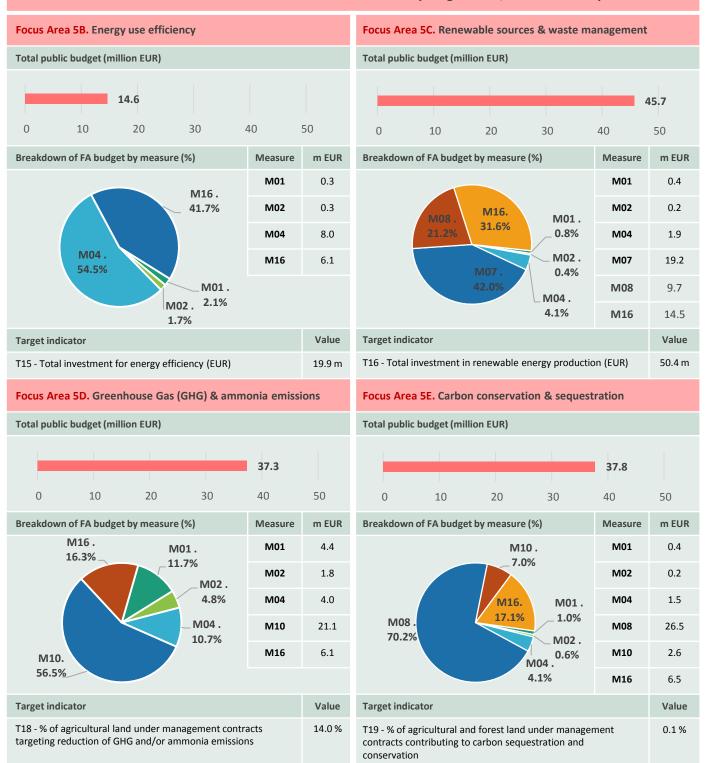

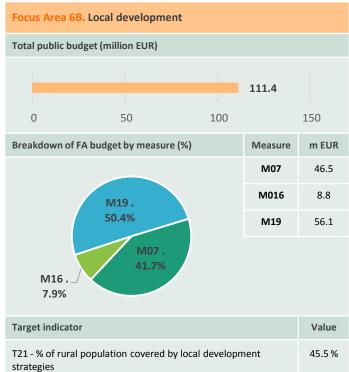

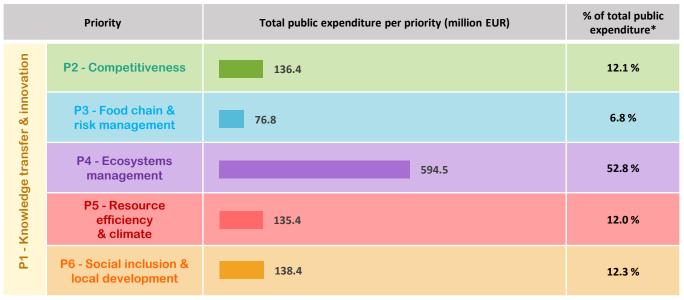

3. Planned expenditure per priority

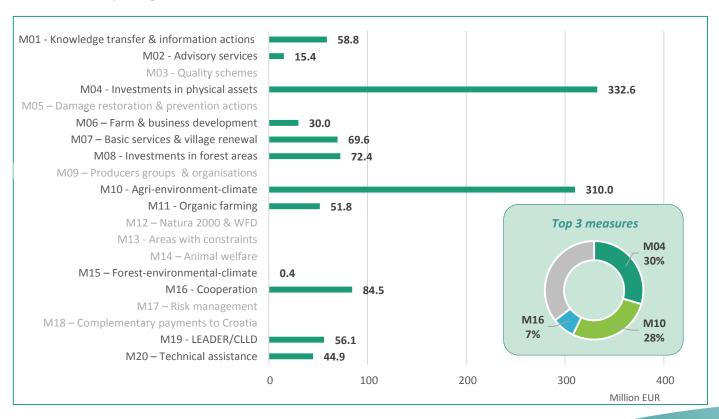

Priority 1 is considered to be cross-cutting and no separate financial allocation is shown as the expenditure is distributed across other focus areas. Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
