

Measure 16 "Co-operation"

Support for the Period of 2014–2020 23,96 mill EUR



- Support for the establishment and operation of operational groups of the EIP (16.1)
- Support to co-operation among small operators (16.3)
- Support to promote short food chains and local markets on the local level (16.4)





Beneficiaries

Sub-measure 16.3 Support for co-operation among small operators	Support to promote short food chains and local markets on the local level
Small farms (with the minimum economic size expressed in standard produce of EUR 4000 – till 7 999)	farmers
Small forest holders (the forest holding shall not exceed 10 ha),	Agricultural product and foodstuff producers and processors
Micro companies (that operate for at least 2 years)	SMEs operating in rural areas
Natural persons engaged in individual activities under the procedure prescribed by national law.

Support intensity

- 100% shall aplly for running cost of the cooperation and cost of drawing up the project's business plan;
- 60% for cost of implementing the project's business plan, but if the cost can be supported under other Programme measures, shall be the same as it is in those other measure (whit the possibility to increase support intensity)
- 100% shall aplly for running cost of the cooperation, cost of drawing up the project's business plan and short supply chain and local markets promotion;
- 60% for cost of implementing the project's business plan, but if the cost can be supported under other Programme measures, shall be the same as it is in those other measure (whit the possibility to increase support intensity)

Issues due support intensity

Questions:

- 1. How to identify the support intensity, when the cost of sub-measure 16.3 corresponds to sub-measure 6.3 ("Business Start-up aid for the development of small farms")? Can support intensity **of 100** % be applied for sub-measure 16.3 in this case? ("hard investments" such as new equipment, agriculture machinery) Should we take an account, that sub-measure 6.3 ("Business start-up aid for the development of small farms) is **as lump sum** and hasn't support intensity?
- 2. What could be other Programme measures that may correlate/coinsident with the cost of sub-measure 16.4?
- 3. How to set the support intensity for the sub-measure 16.4 when the investments overlap/coinsident with the others Programme measures (e.g. with Measure 4.1 "Investments in physical assets")?





Issues due support intensity

► What will be the support intensity in this two cases (Examples)

➤ Group of small farms that participate in sub-measure 16.3 want to buy tractor. What support intensity for hard investment will be in this case: 60% as it is in sub-measure 16.3 or 100% as it is in sub-measure 6.3, which are provided as lump sum for beneficiaries? Or like in measure 4.1?

Farmers that participate in sub-measure 16.4 want to buy refrigerators for milk. What support intensity for "hard investment" (refrigerators) will be in this case: 60% as it is in sub-measure 16.4 or 50% (with the possibility to increase till 70%) as in Measure 4.1 "Investments in physical assets"?
